If you're a Registered Nurse with a bachelor's degree in nursing, the MSN-PMHNP program may be right for you. In the program, you'll learn the skills needed to take on a critical role in mental healthcare, collaborating with a team in providing safe, effective, coordinated care. As a member of the team, you will:

- · Use evidence-based services and therapies to provide diagnoses and plan care for patients with complex psychiatric and medical issues, including furnishing and managing relevant medications.
- · Work as an advocate for patients and their families to ensure that all are engaged and actively participating in a behaviroal healthcare program.
- Expand your professional nursing skills to manage the acute and chronic behavioral health issues of those in need.

Upon graduation, you'll be eligible to sit for National Board Certification as a Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner.

Program Highlights:

- Program practicum is completed in faculty-approved clinical settings and online via telemedicine with preceptors
- Degree can be completed in as few as 18 months
- · Courses are 4-12 weeks long
- · Board certification review course for nurse practitioner specialties included
