- · Covers: measurement, assessment, skill acquisition, behavior reduction, reporting, and ethics
- No prerequisites open to all learners (high school diploma/GED recommended)
- Finish within 180 days (minimum five days) with six-month access to materials
- Earn a Certificate of Completion for the training, and take and pass the RBT exam
