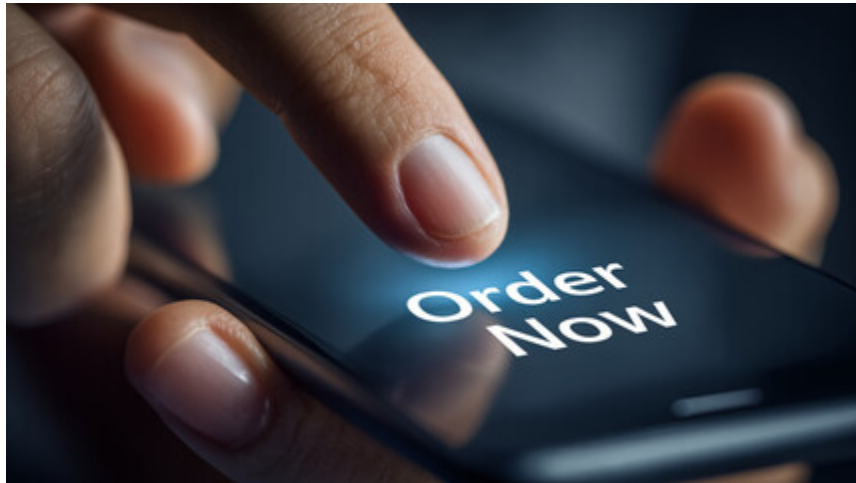


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Overview

Percocet is a prescription medication widely used to treat moderate to severe pain. It combines oxycodone, an opioid pain reliever, with acetaminophen, a non-opioid pain reliever, to provide effective analgesia.
